**SENATOR MOORE & REPRESENTATIVE FROST ANNOUNCE  
EDUCATIONAL FUNDING FOR FY10**

*Governor pledges \$168 million for schools across Massachusetts*

**BOSTON**— State Senator Michael O. Moore (D-Millbury) and Representative Paul K. Frost (R-Auburn), are pleased to announce the Town of Auburn has been pledged \$815,609 of the \$168 million dollars in federal education recovery funds for Fiscal Year 2010 listed by Governor Deval Patrick.

The recovery funds are meant to ensure that all school districts within the Commonwealth will reach the allotted foundation spending levels within the next school year, helping to avoid program and staffing cuts.

“This funding is extremely important to the Town of Auburn and to the school district,” said Senator Moore. “The ability to retain staff members and programs within our schools is essential for students to receive the level of education they need and deserve.”

“I am pleased the Town of Auburn is slated to receive these education funds from the federal government. However, I caution the community that these federal funds will not last forever. It is very possible there could be budget shortfalls in a few years when these federal funds dry up and our communities should plan accordingly,” said Representative Frost.

The federal stimulus money will be distributed to 166 school districts within Massachusetts.
